

SICK CALLS





Beloved in Christ.

"You are witnesses of these things" (Luke 24: 48). This Sunday, we hear again about the appearance of the Risen Christ to his disciples. The resurrection of Jesus is a pivotal and life-changing event in Christianity that warrants its celebration for the fifty days of Eastertide. This past week, on Monday, the sun's total eclipse had an impression on the entire country. Many of us looked at the sky to witness this tremendous celestial event. It impacted our lives, and many bore witness to what they saw on social media. The appearance of Jesus is a billion times more impactful on our world and life and demands our witness.

The disciples on the way to Emmaus bore witness to the risen Christ who made his resurrection known to them in the breaking of the bread and the Scripture. He made himself known to the disciples and showed them he was not a ghost but a bodily person. He showed them his hands and feet as evidence that he is flesh and blood, not a phantom figure. He even ate a piece of baked fish they had prepared. In addition, Jesus opened their minds to understand from the Scripture that he is the fulfillment of the law and the prophets. Jesus revealed enough of his resurrected body to his disciples to empower them to bear witness to the power of the resurrection, the forgiveness of sin, and grace-filled life in union with him.

The resurrection of Jesus is a life-transforming event the disciples bore witness to, as we read from the first reading, Acts 3. Jesus Christ is the fulfillment of the Scripture about the suffering Messiah who will be put to death but whom God raised from the dead: "Of this we are witnesses," Peter says. We are witnesses to the crucified and risen Christ in our own lives. We have experienced victories over the darkness of sin. Jesus has been our joy and peace. In many ways, we are not depressed or hopeless at the reality of death. The resurrection of Jesus is life-changing. Do we believe this truth and share that faith with others? We are witnesses to this sacred event, and we must let others know about it.



Sharing God's Bounty

Whom Are You Looking At?

The disciples were thrilled. They had their Lord back in their presence once again. Since his Resurrection, he had appeared to them and others several times. They were still a little confused, though, when he talked about "waiting for the gift his Father promised" (Acts 1:5), and, then, "He was taken up before their very eyes, and a cloud hid him from their sight" (Acts 1:9).

You can imagine their bewilderment. He had died and been buried and then had risen from the dead! He had walked among them and taught them again, and now . . . He is taken up into the clouds. No wonder they stood there – probably with mouths agape – looking into the sky where they had last seen him.

It took "two men dressed in white" (Acts 1:10) to bring them back to their senses. "'Men of Galilee,' "they said, 'why do you stand here looking into the sky? This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into Heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into Heaven'" (Acts 1:11).

Back they went to Jerusalem. Their eyes were no longer on the clouds, but they were still looking at Jesus. They waited. They prayed. They chose another disciple. And they waited some more - all the while looking at Jesus.

Whom are you looking at? Yes, Jesus has ascended. We can only imagine his



joyful, triumphant return as all the hosts of Heaven welcomed back the risen, victorious Savior. Because he is that Savior, because he is the Author and perfecter of our faith, "let us fix our eyes on Jesus" (Hebrews 12:2). Through his Word and Sacraments, he will lead us in his ways; he will teach us obedience and self-sacrifice; he will teach us love for our neighbors. With joyful and generous hearts, we celebrate the new life that Easter brings us by sharing the message of the Cross and the Empty Tomb with all who will listen. Keep looking at Jesus until in Heaven you see him face to face!



Stewardship is not about large giving, but gifts in small ways. A child's gift, although small, gives glory to the Lord in many ways. Stewardship does not have to be in monetary ways. A gift of time to an elderly shut-in serves the Lord, too, A gift of a loaf of bread to a homeless family could mean the difference between going to bed hungry or going to bed satisfied.
